Brief Guidelines for EMHCs (Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion)

Current Snapshot: July 8, 2021

- We'd like to have approximately 1 Communion station (including the presider) for every 75-100 attendees.
 - 9am & 11am: We're guessing that means 2-3 Communion stations (1 presider + 1-2 EMHCs). Let's start with just 2 (1 + 1) and see how that works.
 - 6:30pm: We're guessing that means 2 Communion stations (1 presider + 1 EMHC)
- All Communion Ministers must wear a mask while distributing communion.

Before Mass:

- Check to ensure the key is in the tabernacle.
 - o If it's not, the key is probably on the presider's cart, up near the altar.

Before Communion:

- Note for 9:00am Mass: Communion is distributed at the very end of Mass, after the final blessing. Retrieve the ciborium at that time.
- Ensure that you are wearing a mask.
- 1. One EMHC should **retrieve the ciborium from the tabernacle** during the Sign of Peace. There is hand sanitizer located in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. Ensure it has fully dried before retrieving the ciborium.
- 2. Place the ciborium on the altar near the Missal (book), then move to the far side of the altar and stand near the cart. After receiving communion, **sanitize** your hands again using the sanitizer on the cart.
- 3. Once sanitized, the presider will hand you the ciborium. **Hold it in your left hand only**, keeping your right hand free to guarantee it is uncontaminated.


During Communion:

- Anyone receiving on the tongue should wait until the end. Don't enforce this rule.
- Use the hand sanitizer on the pedestal as needed (e.g., after making contact with parishioners, especially if they are receiving on the tongue).

If there are 2 Communion stations:

(i.e., the presider and 1 other communion minister)


- The presider will start with the section closest to the choir.
- The other communion minister will start at the centre aisle.
- Both move to their right until everyone has received.



If there are 3-4 Communion stations:

(*i.e.*, the presider and 2-3 other communion ministers)

- The **presider** will distribute to the sections closest to the **choir** (and to the choir).
- The **other** communion ministers will be located on the **other green crosses**, starting at the centre aisle.
- All communion stations will distribute to the **section to their left first**, and then to their right.
- If there are only 3 communion stations, the one furthest from the choir will likely distribute to everyone past that point.



After Communion:

- 1. Return the ciborium to the altar and step to the side.
- 2. Once the presider hands you the ciborium, return it to the tabernacle.
- 3. Sanitize your hands again, and return to your seat.

Brief Guidelines for Greeters

Current Snapshot: July 8, 2021

Before Coming to Mass

• Try to familiarize yourself with the general information we have available on our website. (Click the big black Mass Times banner to get to the *Back to "Normal"* page.)

Before Mass:

- Masks are not required. You are welcome to wear a mask or not according to your own discretion.
- Greet people warmly as they arrive.
- Answer questions and provide information to the extent you're able.
- Please avoid shaking hands and other physical contact at this time.

I think that's all right now?

It's simple, but an extremely important ministry, especially for those who have not been back to church for over a year.

Brief Guidelines for Ushers

Current Snapshot: July 8, 2021

Before Mass:

- Help people find seats as needed.
- Particularly in the last 5 minutes, help direct people to avoid congestion at the entrance.
- Masks are not required. You are welcome to wear a mask or not according to your own discretion.

During Communion:

- 1 Usher should direct traffic for each Communion station.
 - o 9am & 11am: We anticipate 2-3 Communion stations. We're starting with just 2.
 - o 6:30pm: We anticipate 2 Communion stations.
- Keep an eye out for anyone who is unable to come forward to receive communion. Direct the presider to them after everyone else has received.

If there are 2 Communion stations:

(i.e., the presider and 1 other communion minister)

- The **presider** will start with the section closest to the **choir**.
- The **other** communion minister will start at the **centre**
- Both will move to their right until everyone has received.


If there are 3-4 Communion stations:


(*i.e.*, the presider and 2-3 other communion ministers)

- The **presider** will distribute to the sections closest to the **choir** (and to the choir).
- The **other** communion ministers will be located on the **other green crosses**, starting at the centre aisle.
- All communion stations will distribute to the section to their left first, and then to their right.
- If there are only 3 communion stations, the one furthest from the choir will likely distribute to everyone past that point.

After Mass:

- Bring any donations to the safe.
- Ensure that two people are working together.
- 1. Collect any donations from the collection bowls.
- 2. Get a clear ziplock back from the Sacristy.
- 3. Place the donations in the bag, and then drop it down the slot in the Boardroom.
 - o Feel free to also do this near the beginning of Mass if there are donations.





Brief Guidelines for Coordinators

Current Snapshot: July 8, 2021

The Coordinator role is slowly getting back to normal.

 Masks are not required, except for Communion Ministers. You are welcome to wear a mask or not according to your own discretion.

Ensure ministries are filled if possible:

- 1-2 Greeters, 2-3 Ushers, 1-2 Communion Ministers (EMHCs), 1 Reader
- For Ushers & Communion Ministers:
 - We'd like to have approximately 1 Communion station (including the presider) for every 75-100 attendees, and 1 Usher for each station.
 - 9am & 11am: We're guessing that means 2-3 Communion stations (1 presider + 1-2 EMHCs). Let's start with just 2 stations (1 + 1) and see how that works.
 - o 6:30pm: We're guessing that means 2 Communion stations (1 presider + 1 EMHC)
- If needed, the choir (at 9am & 11am) can likely provide a Reader.

Be familiar:

 Read (or at least skim) the guidelines for the other ministries so that you're generally aware of how things are running.

Assist or fill in if necessary:

• With so few ministers (and few volunteers) right now, jump in as needed. Thank you.

Brief Guidelines for Readers

Current Snapshot: July 8, 2021

In General:

- We just have a single Reader right now.
- Most of the time, you'll do everything:
 - o 1st Reading
 - o Responsorial Psalm
 - o 2nd Reading
 - o Prayers of the Faithful
- Masks are not required. You are welcome to wear a mask or not according to your own discretion.

The Choir:

- A member of the choir will likely lead the Psalm.
- We typically have a choir at the 9am and 11am Mass times.
- It's probably simplest to just step back a bit during the Psalm, rather than returning to your seat and then coming back up again.
