MONTH OF THE ROSARY: The History of the Rosary

Saint Pope Pius V was so convinced that Our Lady's intercession had brought victory that he wanted the victory to be liturgically celebrated throughout the Catholic world every year. In March of 1572, he instituted the annual Feast of Our Lady of Victory, directing that it be celebrated every year on October 7, the date of the actual Battle of Lepanto. He didn't stop there, though. In a document titled *Salvatoris Domini*, he granted a plenary indulgence to all those who, in addition to celebrating the feast on October 7, also commemorated the great victory of Lepanto on the first Sunday of October, the day of the month that the Battle of Lepanto had taken place. This annual commemoration became known as "Rosary Sunday."



Initially, the plenary indulgence for Rosary Sunday was only granted to members of the Confraternity of the Rosary, but it was later extended to all the faithful. The Indulgence was praised and confirmed by many subsequent popes in official documents.

One year after St. Pope Pius V established the Feast of Our Lady of Victory on October 7 and Rosary Sunday on the first Sunday of October, the Dominicans requested that there be a feast specifically titled "Our Lady of the Rosary." Pope Gregory XIII granted their request in 1573, in a document titled *Monet Apostolus*. In that document, which acknowledged that it was St. Dominic who founded the rosary, the pope transferred the Feast of Our Lady of Victory from October 7 to the first Sunday of October and gave the new feast the title "Our Lady of the Rosary." By doing this, Rosary Sunday and the liturgical commemoration of Our Lady of the Rosary became one day (not October 7 and the first Sunday of October, as St. Pope Pius V had done). However, Pope Gregory XIII restricted the annual celebration to churches that had a rosary altar. Later, in 1671, Pope Clement X extended the feast to every church in Spain, and in 1716, Pope Clement XI extended the feast to the entire Church.

Liturgically, once the rosary had its own proper Mass, the Opening Prayer from that Mass began to be used by everyone as a prayer to conclude the rosary:

*O, God, whose only-begotten Son, by his life, death and resurrection,
has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life; grant, we beseech thee,
that, meditating upon these mysteries of the most holy rosary of the
Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what
they promise, through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.*

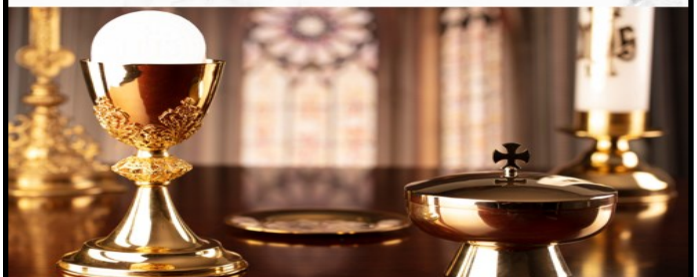
