

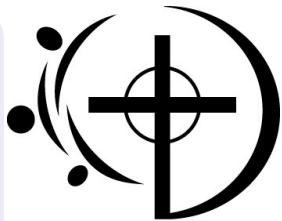

Yesterday, November 1, we celebrated the Feast of All Saints, whereby we honour and give thanks for the great cloud of witnesses, the saints, known and unknown, canonized and uncanonized. Today we celebrate the Feast of All Souls whereby we remember and pray for all the faithful departed. The practice of praying for the dead has always existed in the Church; however, an official feast day in honour of the faithful departed sprung up gradually over time. In the early Church the names of the dead were recorded in the diptychs (special notebooks) and recited during the mass (*Catholic Encyclopedia*).

Monasteries and dioceses began to appoint specific dates within the liturgical year to honour the dead. St. Odilo of Cluny, the fifth abbot of Cluny, ordered in 988 that the commemoration of the dead take place annually in all the monasteries of his congregation on November 2, after the Feast of All Saints Day (Saunders, par. 14). Eventually November 2 was adopted throughout the Church for the celebration of this feast.

Nevertheless it is important to arrive at the *raison d'être* for this feast day and the question that often comes to mind: why do we need to pray for the faithful departed? This question assumes a need on the part of the dead, and as Catholics, we know that this need does in fact exist, because we believe in purgatory. Purgatory is not to be confused with the punishments of hell, where the soul is eternally separated from God. Rather, as the Catechism elaborates, "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (CCC 1030). In purgatory the soul is cleansed from all of one's incapacities to love as one ought.

On this side of life, I suppose it is like asking oneself the questions "have I arrived?" or "am I as holy as I should be?" For myself, the answer to these questions is a resounding "no". There is still much work to be done. Though I have a great desire to love unselfishly, there is still much that gets in the way, whether it is an undue attachment to the things of this world or the rectitude of intention to become the man God wants me to be and created me to be. We are created to give ourselves wholly and completely in love to our God. When we die, if there is anything that holds us back from fully and completely giving the gift of ourselves, even though our sins have been forgiven, purification is needed.

Our prayers for the deceased matter because in some small way it benefits them and helps them in the process of purification. We are not islands to ourselves. Together we form one body in Christ, and therefore our lives are caught up with each other. Maybe you have had the experience of randomly thinking about a deceased friend or loved one. Perhaps this is an invitation to lift this person up to God in prayer.

Throughout the month of November, we will have the opportunity to record the names of our deceased loved ones in a special binder in the welcoming area in order to call them to mind and gratefully remember them in our prayers. A mass will be offered at the end of the month for all those recorded in the binder.

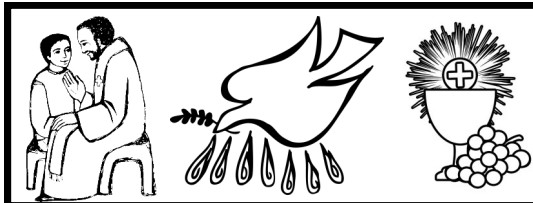
