

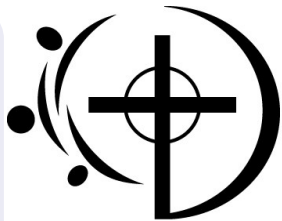

We are Holy Family

1st Sunday of Advent - November 30th, 2014

Advent is here, but where are we? This is a question I've mull'd over this past week, shocked that this great season of preparation is already upon us.

Whatever our answer might be, one thing is certain: we need to be ready for Christ; and we are made ready by good preparation.

I remember when I was a kid and it was our family's turn to host the annual Christmas get together. This was always a time of great excitement, anticipation, and preparation. My Mom would get my brother and I to help clean the house. I would always tidy up the basement, and sneak over to the deep freeze after vacuuming the stairs to eat some baking Mom had stashed away for Christmas. "The labourer deserves his wage, I told myself." My mother always knew what was going on, however. Things were too quiet, she no doubt realized:

"You better not be eating my rocky-road squares!!"

"Rats, I thought I was being stealthy!"

Perhaps one of the fondest memories I have next to the celebration itself, was sitting on the chair nearest the picture window in the living room with my face pressed up against the glass, waiting with eager anticipation until the first car pulled into the drive. It was then a mad dash to the front door to joyfully welcome our guests.

I'm sure that many of you can relate with this experience, thinking back upon your own childhood, or seeing this very scene played out for you right now with your own children: "How many more sleeps until Christmas? How many?" Would that we'd wait for the Lord with this same eager anticipation. Perhaps, we need to be especially mindful of those things that hinder our preparation, or those things that prevent us from entering into the joy of waiting for the Lord. Yes, I use these two words deliberately and place them together - joy and waiting. Our waiting can be a joyful experience because we know that our Lord is coming. If we have prepared well it is a joy to wait for the one whom we love.

The gospel reading today encourages us to "keep watch", to "keep awake" so that when our Master comes, we may receive him well.

There will be many opportunities throughout these weeks of Advent to renovate our hearts in the confessional, allowing the Divine carpenter to do His work. He likes an open concept and loves to tear down walls. Let us approach the Sacrament with confidence and courage, along with our contrition, so that filled with His abundant joy, we may run to welcome Him.

Year of Consecrated Life

On this first Sunday of Advent, our Church begins a special year thanking God for calling women and men to vowed life in service to the church and the world.

Since the call of the first disciples, some followers of Jesus have sought a different way to live their faith. In the early Church, groups of widows gathered to dedicate themselves to prayer and good works. Others craved solitary prayer, so they fled to the desert to commune with God and guide others in the pursuit of holiness. Monasteries, cloisters, and religious houses eventually came into being, and religious life as we know it began to take shape. Consecrated life — in its diverse expressions around the globe — is a gift to the church and world. Its prayer lifts the entire church. Likewise, good works and the pursuit of justice shape society to more closely resemble the reign of God. A life of chastity, poverty, and obedience gives powerful witness to faith in Jesus without a word being uttered. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, religious communities of men and women rise up, serve a purpose, thrive, and live on or come to an end.
