

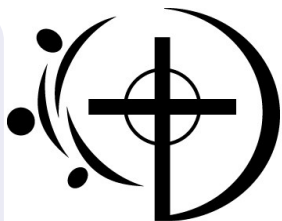

From the Pastor's Desk...

A Listening Heart

When we celebrated the official opening of our parish in 2012, a special commemorative hymn was penned by composer Bob Hurd for the occasion entitled "A Listening Heart." The hymn called us as a community to be receptive to the calling of the Holy Spirit and a willingness to be led by that same Spirit wherever it is that God wills.

In our Advent journey we too are called to be people of "a listening heart," recognizing the needs of the community and responding to them with a generosity that is based on our gratitude to God for all of his blessings. A listening heart is not something that is purely passive. Instead it is something that is engaging and every moving. A listening heart places itself in the very midst of the struggles and darkness of the world and promotes a message of peace, compassion and love. In our First Reading today we hear those most beautiful words of the prophet Isaiah "Comfort, give comfort to my people and speak tenderly to her." This passage from scripture marks the beginning of the return of the people of Israel from exile and it assures them that God's love had triumphed. In our own proclamation of comfort we must assure the world of that same promise: God's love has triumphed.

In a few short weeks we too will celebrate that reality of the triumph of God's love - when the incarnate Son is revealed to us in the manger at Bethlehem. Our journey to the manger is one that encourages us to seek within with a listening heart to see where God's grace and favour has been a constant companion on our journey of life. And, as we see how faithful God has been to us we then seek to be faithful to God by being present to all those around us and reminding them of the triumphant love of God.
