

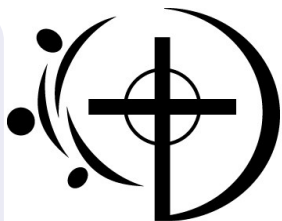

What is prophecy and what is the role of the prophet? Often we think of a prophet as one who foretells the future and warns people of impending disaster and gloom. Though this indeed represents one aspect of prophecy, it by no means captures the heart of the prophet's mission and activity. In the biblical tradition, prophets were those who spoke for God. In fact, the Hebrew word for prophet, *nabi'*, means interpreter or mouthpiece of God (Calès). The main message of the Old Testament prophets was for the people to turn back to the Lord and to remember God's covenant. Essentially, they called the people to conversion of heart and spelled out the consequences if they did not heed the call (Hahn 736).

In the first reading from Deuteronomy, Moses speaks about the coming of a prophet like him who will speak every word that God commands (18). Tradition has shown that Moses is referring to Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. Jesus himself quotes this very verse from John's gospel, responding to the unbelief and hardness of heart of his hearers saying, "I did not speak on my own, but the Father who sent me commanded me what to say and speak" (12:49). In the gospel reading we encounter people who are astounded at Jesus' authority. There is no disparity between his words and his deeds. His word perfectly accomplishes what it is intended to accomplish.

We know that Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah, the 'anointed one', and that previously in Israel, those who were anointed were consecrated for a specific mission whether they were priests, kings, or in rare circumstances, prophets. It makes perfect sense, then, that the Messiah, anointed by the Holy Spirit, would perfectly fulfill this threefold office of priest, prophet, and king, in order to inaugurate the kingdom of God (CCC 436).

At each of our own baptisms, we were anointed with chrism, signifying that we too have been anointed with the Holy Spirit and share in this threefold office of Christ as priest, prophet and king. Listening to Christ's word and placing ourselves under his authority which he has given to the Church, we too must proclaim a prophetic word. In the wake of repeated attacks on the sanctity of human life and in particular the push for physician-assisted suicide and euthanasia gaining ever-increasing momentum in this country, words of truth need to be spoken. Perhaps, part of the battle concerns words themselves. We mustn't allow words such as mercy, compassion, and dignity to be usurped and assigned new meanings that in reality signify their exact opposites. We mustn't allow euphemisms to mask reality and to deceive.

Together let us listen to the voice of truth and respond with courage.

In acting to create a culture where euthanasia and assisted suicide are no longer desired, there is endless hope. However there is also a gap, and to narrow that gap requires all of us to **act** now through advocacy, relationship and education. Advocacy involves being a voice for the voiceless and taking political action. Contact your political representatives, and ask your parish to participate in the postcard campaign.
