

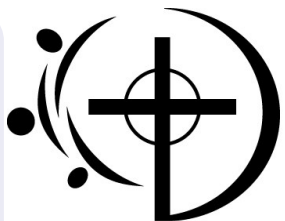

From the Pastor's Desk...

Eyes That See With Faith

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In today's Psalm the words resonate so clearly with us, "The Lord has done great things for us, we are filled with joy." Truly, joy is the most wonderful response to all that God gives to us. Joy is the powerful proof of a hope-filled life and the grace that comes from our patience in waiting for God to give to us all that we need. Joy resonates from those who truly see the presence of God in the world and see his hand at work in all things. Joy radiates from those who have found a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and allow him to be part of their everyday existence. Joy is the unflinching certitude of the one who knows that after this life there is a greater life prepared for them.

And so, living in such a blessed country, it is always with sombre sadness that I ask the question, "why are we so joy-less?" Why, in a world in which we have everything, are we so slow to express our joy? Why do we allow the power of darkness to eradicate the shining power of goodness? Why, when we know that we share in the Resurrection do we not joyfully enter into the daily realities of our community and world?

The answer to these questions is simply that we do not look at things with eyes of faith. The man in the Gospel is cured of his physical blindness. All he has wanted in his life is to see. Imagine what it would have been like for his world of darkness to have been turned into living colour? I remember as a youngster when my dad brought home the first colour television, and our joy at that would have been miniscule as compared to the man who had his sight restored.

Today we need to ask our Lord to not restore our physical blindness, for we can all see, but rather to heal our spiritual blindness: blindness that prevents us from seeing where beauty and love is ever-present in our world even amidst pain and darkness; blindness that relies solely on myself rather than relying on the grace of God; blindness that hides rather than discovers. When we are able to look with eyes of faith and eyes that are not hindered by spiritual blindness, then we can indeed join our song of gladness with the Psalmist who cried out "the Lord has done great things for us, we are filled with joy."

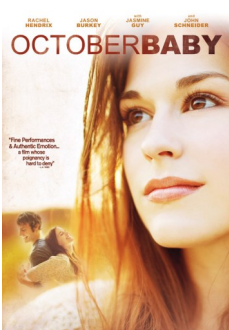
