



Year of Mercy: Opening of Holy Door

Pope Francis has proclaimed an Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy to begin on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, **Tuesday, Dec. 8, 2015**. On that day, Pope Francis will open the ceremonial Holy Doors at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. On the following Sunday, Cathedrals around the world will join in solidarity with Rome by opening their own Doors of Mercy.

At the Cathedral of the Holy Family in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon, the great central doors to the worship space have been designated as Holy Doors of Mercy.

The Doors of Mercy will be formally opened during celebration of Eucharist on the Third Sunday of Advent
6:30 p.m. Dec. 13, 2015
at the Cathedral of the Holy Family, 123 Nelson Road.

Visitors to the diocesan Cathedral will be able to enter through the Doors of Mercy from their opening Dec. 13 until their closure Nov. 13, 2016.

Pope Francis has extended his wish that the Jubilee be a living experience with the closeness of the Father, saying: "I am confident that the whole Church, which is in such need of mercy for we are sinners, will be able to find in this Jubilee the joy of rediscovering and rendering fruitful God's mercy, with which we are all called to give comfort to every man and every woman of our time. Do not forget that God forgives all, and God forgives always. Let us never tire of asking forgiveness. Let us henceforth entrust this Year to the Mother of Mercy, that she turn her gaze upon us and watch over our journey: our penitential journey, our year-long journey with an open heart, to receive the indulgence of God, to receive the mercy of God."

"To experience and obtain the Jubilee indulgence, the faithful are called to make a brief pilgrimage to the Holy Door as a sign of the deep desire for true conversion. It is important that this moment be linked, first and foremost, to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to the celebration of the Holy Eucharist with a reflection on mercy. It will be necessary to accompany these celebrations with the profession of faith and prayer for me and for the intentions that I bear in my heart for the good of the Church and of the entire world." – *Pope Francis*.


