

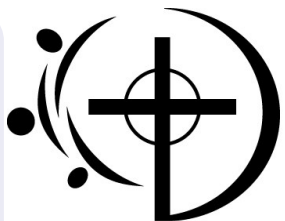

A few years ago I was in a specialty wine store with a good friend eyeing various wines from around the world. Aside from the usual "on the shelf" bottles, there was a special section located behind a locked glass door featuring a more "up scale" selection of wines. Looking like I actually knew something about wines my eyes were drawn to a 2005 Lafite Rothschild. The very kind store employee stood beside me and asked if I was seeing what I was looking for. I noted that they had a 2005 Lafite Rothschild. "It is a truly beautiful wine," said the employee "and we actually have a sale on at this time." Now you have to understand that the only thing I knew about this particular wine was that it was entirely out of my budget, but I proceeded to humour the employee. "A sale," I responded, "and what kind of a sale are you talking about?" Thinking a potential sale was imminent the employee stated enthusiastically, "It is \$2,500 a bottle, but if you buy a case of 12 then we throw in two bottles." I smiled and told the man I would think about it. Approaching my friend I began to tell him the story of what had just happened. When I told him the price of the wine he responded, "and that would have been the wine that Jesus would have created at the wedding in Cana." It was all worth a good and hearty laugh.

The wedding at Cana presents a number of different realities for us to consider. We do know that this was the first recorded miracle in the Gospel of John. It may even seem odd that it wasn't a healing of a sick person or the driving out of a demon. Instead, the first miracle was turning water into wine. And, not just turning water into wine, but turning the water into wine after copious amounts of wine had already been consumed. It was not like there had not been any wine at all. The new wine was to replace what had already been consumed.

We also look at the reasoning behind such a miracle. Theologians have long said that it was done to prepare the people for the greater things they would see in future months and years. Others say that it was necessary in showing to the people that Jesus indeed was the Messiah. But we also have to look at the motivation of Jesus and even that of his Mother. Running out of wine at a party would be one of the most embarrassing things that could happen to a hosting family. Sensing that great catastrophe in their midst it is the Mother of Jesus who tells the stewards to do whatever Jesus commands. The decision made by Jesus to create more wine eliminates the embarrassment, the stress and the worry of the families involved.

This Gospel story reminds us that Jesus is present to our needs at every time and in every circumstance. He is always ready to grant us whatever we ask even if it might be what we consider to be insignificant. Surely, curing a sick person would be more important than producing wine, but the compassion of Jesus is such that even the dignity of the families needed to be upheld. We too must have that courage to ask for whatever it is that is needed even if what we ask might seem trivial. He is ready to serve our needs and grant our requests. We simply need to be reminded that it is okay to ask him.
