

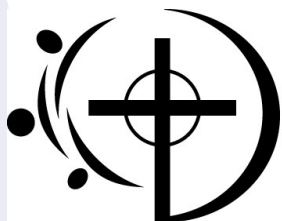

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We live in a world that is ever-changing. So much change, in fact, that we can become overwhelmed by all that is out there. We have difficulty in carving out our own path and being able to see the road that we desire to travel. There are so many interruptions, changes and reschedules. There are days that we seem awfully lost.

In our Gospel today Jesus is confronted with the blind beggar Bartimaeus. All that this man wants is to be able to see again. The grace and the mission of Jesus compels him to restore the sight of the blind man. One of the most beautiful parts of the story is that Bartimaeus' blindness prevents him from finding Jesus on his own. When Jesus acknowledges the voice of the beggar it is the people who lead Bartimaeus to the presence of Jesus.

Our mission and call to discipleship is very similar to what we encounter in the Gospel. In a world that is often times filled with darkness and spiritual blindness we have the responsibility of enlightening our brothers and sisters and leading them into the presence of the Lord. As the people led Bartimaeus into the "new vision" of Jesus Christ so must our words and actions be vessels by which we can bring this same new vision into the hearts of all who live in blindness and all who are overwhelmed by the darkness of their own realities.

Our prayer is that we might be attentive to all those who cry out "Son of David, have mercy." May the gentle reach of our hands lead others to hear the profound words "take heart, the Lord is calling you."

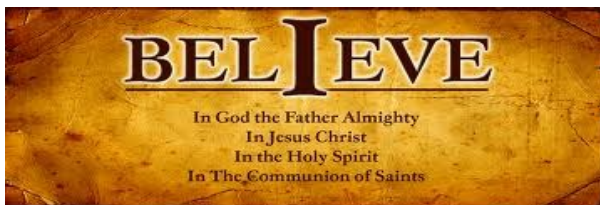
