

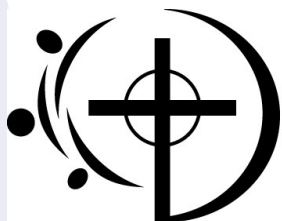

From the Deacon's Desk...

November is always a month to REMEMBER. Of course we have the obvious Remembrance Day Services held throughout Canada on November 11, to honour all those who have served, and many who have given their lives in defense of our country. But there are two other "remembering services" that are much more a part of our liturgical year; November 1 is ALL SAINTS DAY, when we honour all those who have died and have lived a life of worthy service to the Lord and his church. We also celebrate ALL SOULS DAY on November 2 to pray for those who have died and gone before us. These three services remind us to be grateful for the people upon whose shoulders we stand. Things are better for us now because of what they did for us then. Our lives are free-er, our standard of living higher, our ability to worship in freedom safer because others have lived such powerful lives of witness and sacrifice.

All that is asked is to REMEMBER. Don't live in a self-enclosed world of forgetfulness, where "me and mine" and "today" is the only day of importance. A living tradition means we stop to honour those who have given themselves out of love for us, and we are inspired then to give of ourselves for the sake of a brighter future for our children and our children's children.

May we be as courageous and self-giving as the many generations of faithful Christians who did REMEMBER, and thus gave generously of themselves. It is said that the birth of the church continues through the blood of the martyrs who sacrificed everything for the sake of the Gospel.

Today's Gospel reminds us that the ultimate goal of goals is to love the Lord your God with all your mind, soul, heart and strength. But it's when faith-filled people have been willing to put their lives on the line, that we see the extent to which love of God will go. So we remember: loved ones, family members, military and police, those who have died in the past year, all of the Saints who have given their lives out of love for God...
