Unworthiness is a Sign of Strength

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Showing my age again, I harken back to those great evenings when I would watch Saturday Night Live and laugh myself silly listening to Wayne's World skits and the common repetitive phrase of "We're not worthy! We're not worthy!" For many, it was a rallying cry. Being in the presence of someone great or of celebrity status would elicit the same response of "We're not worthy!"

I am not sure who wrote these particular skits but I would almost bet money that one of the writers was thinking back on his or her Catholic upbringing. Where else do we hear those unforgettable words? Since we were children we have been schooled in saying "I am not worthy" prior to receiving Holy Communion.

It is very true. We are not worthy. No one is truly worthy. We are not worthy of God's love. We are not worthy of the companionship of Jesus Christ. We are certainly not worthy of his sacrifice on the cross and we know that we are not worthy of the Kingdom. We might even shy away from offering our gifts or talents, of ministering in the Church or taking a leadership role or position because we feel this sense of unworth. All of the readings today, though, take us in a different direction.

Unworthiness is not seen as the barrier to service and ministry. My own unworth does not prevent me from being an instrument for the greater glory of God.

Isaiah recognizes himself as one with unclean lips. Paul calls himself the least of the Apostles and Peter tells the Lord to go away from him because he is sinful. Each of these individuals recognized their own sinfulness, their own unworthiness and yet offered themselves as a minister for the Lord.

What all of them recognized was that their unworth was the foundation of their strength. It is no different for you and I. When we recognize our faults it is then that we reach out to God for his grace. My lack of worth compels me to trust completely that God will give to me everything that is needed to bring about his message. My own unworthiness means that I depend entirely on the grace and love of God and it is in that grace that I find everything needed to be a minister of God and for God.

Yes we are unworthy, and yet, God makes us worthy. As vulnerable human beings with our limitations and deficiencies, God uses us as vessels of his kindness and love. When I see my limitations I rely less on myself and more on God. And that is all that God asks of me. The very ones who cry out "We're not worthy!" are, in fact, the worthiest ones in the eyes of God.
