



From the Deacon's Desk...

The last time I returned from Lethbridge, I was surprised by a request from the Parish Pastoral Council. You see, a month earlier they had just received notice of my resignation from Holy Family this coming June. They asked me if I would offer a Parish Mission before leaving. About the only time that was possible was a three-day window in March, so I did say yes. It was only after the fact that I realized what I was saying "yes" to!

It is with a great sense of humility that Joan and I would offer a Parish Mission in our own home parish. After all, most mission programs are offered by people from far away. I remember Jesus' admonition that a prophet is never accepted in their own town. But also, I realized it was one of the best going-away gifts that we could possibly offer. So here we are, asking you to come and join us for three short evenings of prayer, song, reflection and community.

The mission will begin at all the masses on Sunday, March 17. It will then continue each evening; **Sunday (8-9p.m.), Monday (7:30-8:30 p.m.) and Tuesday (7:30-8:30 p.m.)** The themes will be: **CRIB, CROSS AND ALTAR**. The first evening is a meditation on the **Incarnation**, the second on **Redemption**, and the third on the **Eucharist**. So if you can spare an hour each night, I promise you it will be a great preparation for the Easter Mysteries that we will celebrate on the following week. My confidence does not come from an inflated notion of my preaching abilities. It comes from 30 years of experiencing the work of the Holy Spirit during a time of Mission!

I'm sure that many of you can point to certain religious activities like a retreat, a pilgrimage, a reflection day or a certain Mass, where you felt changed, renewed, challenged, or forgiven! That is what a mission is about. It is a chance to put ourselves at the receiving end of God's special message; one that is personal, direct, encouraging and healing.

We long for these kind of moments in our life. I once wrote a song about this, called "Moments of Mystery".

Here are just a few of the lyrics to that song:

*Moments of mystery, moments of healing, time to remember just who we are.
Moments of mystery, faith for the journey, with wisdom to see all we can be,
Moments of mystery.*

So I invite you to join us each night for a celebration of God's Word. If you can't make all three nights, do what you can to give the Lord some of your time. Make this Lent a time of Grace and Healing in your life!

Stewardship Corner: Your Faith in Action

Peter, James and John wanted to build a “tent” for Jesus and just stay on the mountain where his transfiguration took place. But the Son of God, the Chosen One, knew that he must instead keep moving toward his crucifixion. We, too, must rise from worship and do what we can to hasten the coming of the Kingdom.
