



From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I think that some times we take for granted the bodies of water that provide for our needs of drinking, bathing and recreating. Every day of my time in seminary residence over the course of 9 years I looked at water. The beautiful South Saskatchewan River was a faithful friend during my time in Saskatoon and while in Toronto I gazed upon Lake Ontario and on clear nights could see across the lake the lights of Rochester. I have always been taken by water. I think the most refreshing days of my young life were spent on the banks of the dugout in our pasture as I spied muskrats and mudpuppies and all sorts of other wildlife. Water always had a calming effect.

Over the course of a few weeks in May and June of 1995 I had the distinct pleasure to gaze upon a number of bodies of water. As I packed my belongings at the end of my studies I said goodbye to Lake Ontario. I flew to the ordination of a good friend and stood by the majestic north Atlantic as its waves beat upon the rocks. Just a few weeks later I was standing by the Pier at Huntington Beach in California with the soft waves of the Pacific gently lapping onto the sand. A week later I was once again gazing at the South Saskatchewan in contemplation of my public commitment to the priesthood.

Each one of these waters held significance. Each one had its own glory and its own sense of power. And yet, behind each of them was a great mystery, a mystery of life and re-generation that I have never fully been able to understand. Maybe that is why I so love the Gospel today of the woman at the well. In her humble nature she enters into the greatest mystery - the mystery of the fullness of God's love; the God who desires that we drink fully of his love so that we might never thirst again. She becomes a role model for each of us as she seeks the answers to the mystery she has encountered.

Like anyone, we too thirst for love. It is this love that is so freely given by Jesus that gives us the comfort and consolation we need. This life giving water fills us with inexpressible joy and leads us to the new life we will experience in Heaven.

Like the Samaritan woman, we say:

Lord give to me this water that I may never thirst again. Knowing that God's mercy and love is ever-present and knowing that our home is truly in Heaven is the assurance that we will never thirst for anything else.

And maybe that is why for me water has such an incredible part in my life. It is a tangible reminder that the love of God is in abundance and all that it requires of me is drink of his mercy.

Prayers for the Church at this Time of Transition

Bishop Donald Bolen is calling on our diocesan faith community to join Christians around the world in praying that the Holy Spirit will guide and inspire the Church and the cardinal-electors as they choose the next pope. **Eucharistic Adoration** is one opportunity for dedicated prayer that's held regularly in many parishes, including the following scheduled weekly times in Saskatoon:
