

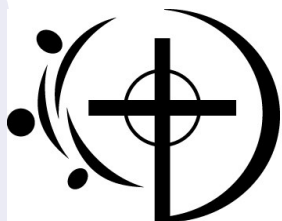

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today the Church Universal celebrates the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It has often been called Good Shepherd Sunday and has, in the past, placed great emphasis on the vocation of the ordained priesthood.

Our readings for today and the Easter call to discipleship suggests that the idea of the shepherding vocation goes beyond the distinction of lay and ordained. The vocation of shepherding is one that is crucial for all followers of Jesus Christ. To imitate the Good Shepherd is such that it draws us into the mystery of the giving of ourselves for the sake of a greater good. The giving of ourselves is not limited to the ordained.

We all must be shepherds of the flock. Each and every time that we place ourselves in the midst of the brokenness of a brother or sister we become a shepherd. It can be simple acts or it can be large acts. Regardless of the size or the magnitude we nevertheless become vessels of the Good Shepherd.

Here are some examples of where I see the flock shepherding each other:

- sitting with a terminally ill person in their final days and hours
- acknowledging the new infants and a word of praise for their parents
- encouraging each other in acts of charity and justice
- not judging members of the flock who may not be as active in their practice as I am
- a Sunday hug for the recent widow, the autistic child, the newly arrived immigrant, the recently separated and divorced
- sharing joy and a smile with the bank teller, the gas pump jockey, the butcher, the hair stylist, etc.
- words of appreciation for all members of the community
- reaching out to those who by choice have removed themselves from the community
- providing a meal for a family who has experienced a recent death
- sharing love and understanding with those who suffer from mental illness
- upholding the dignity and integrity of all God's creation You see, shepherding is by its very nature, a vocation.

On this day of prayer for vocations, let us above all, pray that we will all embrace the call to be Good Shepherds.

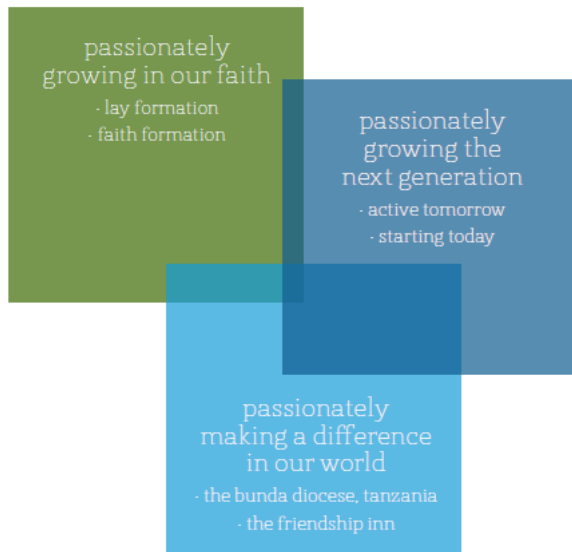

Pedestrian/Vehicle Access at the Cathedral Entrance Plaza

Each Sunday we welcome well over 2,000 people coming to worship at the Cathedral. For the safety of all of our visitors we request your attention when dropping off passengers at the Cathedral entrance. **The Plaza is primarily for pedestrian use. Vehicles should remain in the Loading Zone area on the roadway in front of the building and refrain from driving onto the paving-stone portion of the plaza.** Only if you are dropping off someone with limited mobility (i.e. walker, wheelchair) and you require more time and space to unload, then may you drive onto the paving stones.

Vehicles may not drive closer than 6m (20') to the doors to unload passengers.

If you must unload on the plaza:

- ◆ Allow yourself room to continue to drive through.
- ◆ Don't attempt to back up!
- ◆ Always watch carefully for pedestrians, especially young children.
- ◆ Remember, pedestrians always have the right-of-way.
