PILGRIMS OF HOPE: RECOVERING WHAT IS TRUEST AND DEEPEST IN OURSELVES

What does it mean to "live the Jubilee"? Scripture teaches us in the Book of Leviticus: You shall treat this fiftieth year as sacred [...] It shall be a jubilee for you, when each of you shall return to your own property, each of you to your own family (Lev 25:10). The Jubilee is a time in which each person can reclaim what most truly and deeply belongs to him or her. For us, as the People of God, this is a profoundly meaningful image: to live the Jubilee means, for each of us, to return to possession of what is truest and deepest in ourselves. It is a journey back to the roots of being Church, to the beauty of our vocation within the Church. The Jubilee calls us to walk with renewed hope toward the future of a Church on

mission. It is a favourable time to rediscover the evangelical dynamism that has always animated the ecclesial community, to come out of every form of self-absorption and to open ourselves confidently to the paths of the world. The Jubilee invites us to renew our apostolic zeal, to joyfully bear witness to the Gospel, to build bridges of fraternity, and to promote a culture of encounter. The Jubilee tells us something important: the possibility of returning into possession of what truly belongs to us is not our own achievement, but a gift of God: a door God opens in our life, which we may cross in order to return home.

Mary guides us in our "Jubilee," in the possibility of recovering possession of what is ours. She is like the enduring "guardian" of a synodal and missionary Church. We see the features of a synodal, missionary and merciful Church shining in full light in the Virgin Mary, Mother of Christ, of the Church and of humanity." Mary is the form of the Church who listens, prays, meditates, dialogues, accompanies, discerns, decides and acts.

First of all, Mary is the form of the Church who listens, the fundamental model of a Church of synodal style. At the angel's announcement, Mary knew how to listen to the Word that God addressed to her life, opening new paths, rekindling hope, and making the desert bloom. Today, as Christian communities, we are called to follow Mary's path: in persevering prayer, to be able to listen, among the many voices, to the Word of God. Then Mary is the image of the Church who prays. How much we need to return to an authentic prayer born from listening to the Word of God. Mary was able to listen to God's Word and receive it in her life because she had been formed in the prayer of her people. Listening to the Word is not something improvised, but something prepared for and nourished by prayer.

Mary is the image of a Church of synodal style because she meditates and dialogues. After listening to the Word of God in prayer, Mary measures the events of her existence in her heart in order to discern God's will. In this, Mary is a teacher of ecclesial discernment, a model of a Church which, beginning with listening, discerns the will of God and puts it into practice. But we must not forget Mary's bold dialogue with the angel in the Gospel: Mary is not afraid to converse with God, to express her objections, to raise her doubts... Mary is not a passive interlocutor of God! In Mary we also perceive the image of the Church who decides and acts. In her we see attentiveness to God's will, obedience to God's Word and a readiness to hear the needs of those who are poor and to set out along the path. We also learn the love that reaches out to aid those in need and the song of praise that exults in the Spirit.

Dear brothers and sisters, we too place ourselves in the school of Mary, the image and beginning of the Church, to learn how to be a synodal and missionary Church. In this way, we will be able to live our "Jubilee," to pass through the door that the Lord has opened for us, so that we may reclaim what truly belongs to us as Church. May Mary accompany us, so that the awakening of the Church in souls may continue.


Christmas Cake & Card Sale November 23rd







