



CATHEDRAL OF THE HOLY FAMILY

We are Holy Family

Christ the King — November 24th, 2013

I had the privilege of studying at St. Peter's Seminary in London, Ontario for six years, and one of its most beautiful treasures is its gothic style chapel with stunning stained glass windows. (If you are ever visiting London you should stop in and take a look). Two of the windows that have always struck me flank the left and right side of the tabernacle in the sanctuary.

On the left side is a depiction of Christ presented by Pilate to the people with the Latin inscription "ecce homo", "behold the man" (Jn 19:6). Our Lord's hands are bound fast with ropes, a crown of thorns dig into his brow, a reed sceptre is tucked under his arm, and he is draped in a blood-red cloak. The mocking accoutrement of a seeming self-proclaimed king, is in fact the venerable vesture of the Lord of the Universe, the King of Kings. Jesus' eyes are downcast as he silently suffers these insults for the sake of our salvation. Though he is held fast, he is perfectly free and in this total freedom he lays down his life for our sins, the very sins that nailed him to the tree. Yet, in the midst of this suffering his glory shines behind him pointing to the great hope of new life with him (Prieur, 178). Love Incarnate, loving to the end, binds death to death's end.

The window on the right is Christ reigning in glory, "Rex Aeternae Glorae", the King of Eternal Glory. Robed in royal purple and red, a crown of gold upon his head, he stands in glory, holding the cross-claimed world in his hand. Where the inscription *INRI* (Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews) is framed above his head in the other window, the Alpha and Omega proclaim the complete sovereignty of Christ over all creation, and all that is. The King of Kings imparts his blessing with a nail-pierced hand, the scar, both a reminder of what he endured for our sake and the unfathomable depth of his love.

In between these windows that mark what took place and what will come, is a tabernacle – the risen king is present now – body, blood, soul, and divinity. He does not abandon us in our wait for his return. He gives us the gift of his life to strengthen us in our task, to proclaim the kingdom – may your Kingdom come at last!

My brothers and sisters, we celebrate on this feast of Christ the King, all that our Lord has done for us. May we unite our prayers with his eternal offering and allow our lives to be a "thank you" and a "yes" in return.

LOW-GLUTEN HOSTS: The Cathedral of the Holy Family is now pleased to offer low-gluten hosts for those individuals who suffer from gluten sensitivity. These hosts are approved by the Church's Canon Law and contain a gluten level not exceeding 0.01%. Due to the nature of the composition of the Eucharistic bread there is no totally gluten free Eucharistic bread that is available and approved for use. During the Sunday celebrations of the Eucharist we will be consecrating low-gluten hosts for those who desire them. In preparation for this we ask that those who are presently intolerant to gluten to please call us and make us aware that you are in need of a low-gluten host and identify what time you attend Mass. If you desire, you can stop by the Church during the week and try an unconsecrated host to see if there are any negative reactions to it. At each of the Masses the desired number of low-gluten hosts will be consecrated for those requesting them. One Extraordinary Minister of Communion will be identified as having the low-gluten consecrated bread. Those parishioners who have identified themselves will then be asked to go to that particular Minister for Communion. We will only be consecrating the number of low-gluten hosts that are requested by the people. When you arrive at the Church please go to the Sacristy and inform either the Sacristan or the priest that you desire a low-gluten host.
